Prayers of Adoration, Thanksgiving and Confession

A Creator God,

You have made a beautiful world filled with wonder and surprises!

C We adore You.

A Creator God,

who has gifted us with the blessing of animals, those in the wild, those on farms, those in our own homes.

C We adore You.

A Creator God,

You brought into being that which we could not imagine for ourselves, life we cannot see without the aid of microscopes, animals we can only see in pictures from remote regions of this planet earth.

C We adore You.

A We thank You for abundant life;

for the birds we hear in the morning,

for the drone of the bees when we are outside,

for the vast tapestry of life which is interwoven.

C We give You thanks.

A We thank You for the gift of our own animal companions;

for the joy they bring us,

for the unconditional love and forgiveness which teaches us about You;

for the confidant, the listener, the stress-releaser,

for the benefits they are to our health, and to our Spirit.

C We give You thanks.

A And yet, we know that we have not always been faithful caretakers of our animals.

Forgive us when we have dirtied their environment, erased places of shelter, polluted the waters, killed off their food supplies or neglected to feed or tend animals in our own communities.

Forgive us when we have neglected our own animal companions.

When we have said we are too busy to play with them,

when we have shooed them away.

When we have made excuses, saying we are too tired ... too busy ... more important engagements have come up ... so that we do not walk them, cuddle them, spend time with them.

C Forgive us.

Forgive us when we have not loved them as they have loved us.

A Forgive us when we have not considered the wider picture; when we have neglected the animals in the wild, the cruelty inflicted in the name of 'sport', or in the name of food production.

Forgive us when we have focused only on our 'favorites' and neglected the care of the supposedly less beautiful, those who hold a lower public profile.

Each year more animals are becoming extinct or are added to the endangered species list: forgive us, for allowing beauty to be forever destroyed.

C Forgive us when we neglect to see all animals as part of Your creation, forgive us when we neglect to acknowledge that Your love beats in all hearts, and that You give breath to all creation.

A God is love.

Through Christ your sins are forgiven, take hold of this forgiveness, and live your life, knowing that you are forgiven, and deeply loved. Know that the Holy Spirit will enable you to live fully, richly, and deeply.

Hebrews 6:19

September 25, 2022 LECTIONARY 26 Optical Illusions

Have you ever seen one of those pictures that changes depending on how you look at it? Is it a rabbit or a duck? Is it a vase or two faces looking at one another? A young woman or an old one? Sometimes our first impression of something gets in the way of us seeing it another way.

In the parable Jesus tells today, there is a man with wealth and influence who has always seen his life as a success. That success seems all the more pronounced in contrast to a poor, sick beggar who is always hanging around the entrance to his house. But when the rich man dies, he realizes that his life was actually the opposite of what he thought. It was not his possessions or status that mattered; it was the justice and love he showed to others. When it came to those things, he was far more impoverished and much sicker than the man he looked down on every day.

When we look at our own lives, it can be easy to get stuck in just one way of seeing them. If we focus on worldly standards, we may judge ourselves as successes or failures in ways that are out of touch with how God sees us. With this parable, Jesus calls us to new ways of looking at ourselves. Where are we missing the opportunities right outside our front door to act with love and justice for our siblings near and far?

In Christian worship, we gather to practice the way our lives and our world appear to God. We lift up the cries that have gone unheard. We look at one another and ourselves through the redemptive waters of baptism. We feed one another around the table that Christ sets for us all in our common need. As witnesses to God's truth, we send one another forth to shatter misguided illusions in the world around us.
